



1° Be impeccable with your word

Don't assume. Take nothing for granted. If you have doubts, clarify them. If you suspect, ask. Speak with integrity. Say only what you mean. Avoid using the word to speak against yourself or gossip about others. Use the `power of your word in the direction of true and love.

2° Don't take anything personally.

Honor your words. Coherent with what you do and you think and feel. Being authentic make you respectful to yourself and others. What other do and think is a projection of their own reality, their own dream.

3° Don't make assuptions.

What comes out of your mouth is what you are. Find the courage to ask questions and express what you really are. Communicate with others to avoid misunderstandings, sadness and drama.

4° Always do your best.

Always do the best you can. Under any circumstances do your best. You will avoid self-judgement, self-abuse, and regret.

5° Acceptance of yourself.

Grants the power of doubt, but learn how to listen.





WHO TO SAY NO

- When I'm struggling to say 'no' (and I do still struggle sometimes, albeit I'm getting better), these are the quotes that support me:
 - * 'If they expect me to say 'yes' then I've trained them to expect me to say "yes'"
 - * 'If they are offended by my saying "no" then these are relationships that need to be considered / examined / questioned'
 - * 'If I'm having trouble saying "no" then there's a small child part of me that's still alive inside me' (I can certainly confirm that one...and I'm passionately working with her too ;))

PRINCESSES AND HEROINES. When I was 3 all my dresses were pink. When I was 6 I wanted a Scalextric and the Three Wise Men. They brought me a cleaning kit (miniature bucket and mop). When I was 8 I wanted to play handball and they signed me up for ballet. When I was 17 in college, some professors asked me to study engineering. At 18, when I obtained the title of pool lifeguard, they tried to convince me that I was not strong enough. I got it the first time. At 19 I applied to become a basketball referee, suffering the laughter of the examiners. I approved it. At the age of 23, a company manager called me during a selection process only to tell me that in no way would I hire a woman but that out of sheer curiosity, I wanted to see what I looked like. I did more than 200 interviews (which one was more curious) to find an engineering job. I was never examined or interviewed by a woman. With my first salary as an engineer, I bought a Scalextric. Between the ages of 19 and 27, I lived in different companies sexist behaviors, micromachisms and expressions such as: "Be quiet, you're prettier" or "Don't be nenazas" and don't protest or "You're unbearable, do you have the mestruation?" or "to win you have to teach" or phrases like "And doesn't it bother your husband that you work all day?" or for example "Miss Teresa, Mr. Martínez, Pérez and García to my office." At the age of 28 I suffered workplace harassment of an unknown person who called me every day by phone from somewhere in the company masturbating. At 29 I had a feeling of invisibility when I gave my opinion and spoke. I was the "girl." When I got pregnant, my husband celebrated in his company and I didn't even know how to say it in mine. At 35 I slapped a colleague for constantly invading my private space, touching me. On my first trip to the USA they expected Mr Busto and not Mrs Busto. They had to change the itinerary of post-work events. When opting for my first managerial position they asked me if I could travel since I had two children. The one who was interviewing me had three and was French. At 40, in a meeting, they made a mistake with the secretary since I was the only woman. With 41 I listen phrases such as "managers will go to dinner with their wives." With 43 I sent letters to supplier companies telling them that as long as their advertising was sexist (semi-naked women advertising their products) they would have no place in my company. With 45 I was VP. He had no bosses, no companions, no providers. I have faced gender stereotypes and I have overcome resistance from subordinates, colleagues or superiors in Spain and outside of Spain. At 52 I was appointed factory director. When I left, 50% of the leadership positions in the factory were women. Today, my 6-year-old niece wants to be a princess even though she only watches motorcycles at home.




